The Board of School Directors met at the Town Hall March 7, 1903, and organized by electing E. E. Congdon Chairman and J. H. Davis Clerk, for the ensuing year.

At a meeting of the Directors on March 14, 1903, M. J. B. Fuller was appointed Superintendent of Schools.

During the year about \$100 has been used for repairs to school buildings, principally at East Street, the Spafford District, North Clarendon and East Clarendon.

Schools of 32 weeks are being maintained in seven school houses in town.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

Fellow Citizens:

Sundries

I have the honor to submit the following report: On the whole I think the schools of Clarendon will average well with similar towns of its capacity.

I suggest:

1st. That all the school houses be put in better repair; painted, roofed where needed and good wind proof foundations laid, with other necessary repairs.

2d. That the heating of the rooms be better arranged than at present, with due regard to prevention of fire.

3d. That the fitness of a teacher be ascertained before hiring.

4th. That the parents visit schools more; the schools depend upon your co-operation, as well as upon the teacher.

5th. That the East Street school be united with another small school. A small school is bad for both scholars and teacher.

6th. That the town use all means to induce children to seek higher education, the cost in dollars and cents will be less in years to come than ignorant administration of uneducated citizens.

I would call attention to the fact that it is an open question whether the town is not obliged to pay the tuition of pupils in some higher institution if requested. Let the town not be niggardly in the matter.

As to the schools of the Town:

East Street has been taught during the entire year by Miss Congdon. Considering the small number of scholars the school was well taught.

East Clarendon school has been taught by Miss Keily and Miss Keyes. The first term by Miss Keily was not a great success, owing we think to the lack of interest in the scholars. Miss Keyes, the teacher for the last two terms, is an energetic, bright, successful teacher.

Clarendon school has been taught by Miss Katheryn O'Rourke and Miss Donnelly. The first two

terms by Miss O'Rourke were very well taught. The last term was less successful.

The Chippenhook school taught during the entire year by Miss Haley merits all praise.

The Clarendon Springs school has been taught by Miss Ridlon, Miss Crosby and Miss Katheryn O'Rourke. Miss Ridlon is a faithful teacher, but failed to win the co-operation of her scholars. Miss Crosby has not the qualities of a good teacher.

The North Clarendon school taught by Miss Julia O'Rourke is as well conducted a school as we ever entered.

The Spafford school taught during the year by Miss Long has steadily improved. Miss Long is an acceptable teacher.

I would strongly recommend that teachers be kept if possible in one school for the entire year.

We must constantly remember that perfection is impossible, but yet we should press on towards the goal of a good school system.
